

Adding Volunteer Projects to the Bay Area Map

1. Use this link to view the map: [Wildland Volunteer Network Map](#)
2. To edit the map, you need to be signed into your Google account (and viewing from "My Maps" rather than the usual Google Maps interface).
3. To add a volunteer project location:
 - a. click "EDIT"
 - b. "Add layer" for your organization if it is not already on the list. Click on the layer so that when you add a project it will be filed under that layer. (You can tell the layer is selected because the left border will be blue. The check box only indicates what is visible on the map.)
 - c. Click the little point icon at the top (looks like a grey hot-air balloon) then click on the map at the location of your site. You can zoom in on the map to get the location right, and you can move your point.
 - d. Fill in label, description and photos for the site. The label for each project site should include: abbreviated group name and name of site (eg "F5C - Cerrito Creek"). The description should include invasive plant species being managed and a link to the group's website.
