Dyer's woad

(*Isatis tinctoria*)

Mature Size Knee



Description

- 1-4 ft. tall annual or short-lived perennial with small bright yellow flowers
- Flowers clustered at end of branch tips have four petals about 1/8 in. long
- Hanging blue-black fruits are 1-4 in. long
- Low-growing arrowhead-shaped leaves form a round cluster
- Leaves on stem are lance-shaped alternate bluish-green and covered with a powdery white film
- Reproduces by seed
- Spread by roads, trails, equipment, hay, forage, seed
- Native to Europe and Asia
